- Gracewood Site is 219 acres with 58 acres in initial development
- "Medium" class cemetery with up to an estimated 749 burials a year
- \$10 million state investment and employ 6 8 people
- Entry monument with twin drives
- Ceremonial area
- In-ground casket burial area
- Columbarium with granite caps and end panels
- In ground Cremains and Memorials
- Scattering Garden
- Campus supported by three buildings:
 - Administration/Visitors
 - Maintenance/Operations
 - Committal Service Shelter

Steps Ahead

- State appropriated 10% for planning on March 31, 2021
- State filed grant application with VA on June 29, 2021
- VA will issue rankings after October 1, 2021
- City of Augusta build access road and site demolitions
- Estimated cemetery begins receiving burials in 3-4 years
- Supporting non-profit to be established through Community Foundation.



Concerns and Diagnosis

- Anxiety
- Adjustment Disorder
- PTSD
- Depression
- COVID related stressors
- Isolation (separation from extended Family, telework, etc.)
- Occupational stressors
- Family problems
- Legal issues (e.g., divorce, chapters, arrests, etc.)
- Average 6-10 patients per week on inpatient unit

Reasons for Hospitalization

- Suicidal Ideation
- Difficulty Adjusting to the Military
- Psychosis

The military is a microcosm of society. The significant impact with COVID-19 pandemic identified adaptive and maladaptive forms of coping with life stressors stated above




Breaking the Stigma

 Difficulty recruiting and retaining Behavioral Health Professionals due to geographical location

CUI

- Access to care
- Less in-person interaction—largely due to COVID
- More Adjustment D/O's due to AIT population/ first time away from home/new environment
- TMS therapy options (Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation)
- Network opportunities
- Access to start substance abuse medication
- IOP (Intensive Outpatient Program), costly in the community and availability


