# World War I



Alvin Cullum York, also known as Sergeant York, was one of the most decorated United States Army soldiers of World War I. He received the Medal of Honor for leading an attack on a German machine gun nest, taking at least one machine gun, killing at least 25 enemy soldiers and capturing




- The United States Army established many war-training camps during [World War I](#). [Chamblee](#), northeast of Atlanta, was selected for one of the state's largest army cantonments.

- It was named Camp Gordon in honor of [John Brown Gordon](#), who was a major general in the Confederate army, a Georgia governor, a U.S. senator, and a businessman.

- The camp opened in July 1917, becoming a training site and home of the famous [82nd Division](#).<sup>[3]</sup> The division was composed of men from several different states, but men from Georgia made up almost half its number. Among the men trained at Camp Gordon, during that period, was the future [Congressional Medal of Honor](#) recipient [Alvin York](#).<sup>[4]</sup>







# World War II

- Camp Gordon was approved as the name for a WWII division training camp which began construction in July 1941.
- The U.S. War Department approved a contract to construct facilities on a new training area near Augusta, in [Richmond County, Georgia](#) that had been selected several months earlier.
- Colonel Herbert W. Schmidt, camp commander, moved his small staff from his temporary office in the [Augusta](#) post office building to the unfinished headquarters building at Camp Gordon on 9 December 1941 and the 4th Infantry Division began to establish operations there.
- The post was home to three divisions during the war; the 4th Infantry, the 26th Infantry, and the 10th Armored. From October 1943 to January 1945 Camp Gordon served as an internment camp for foreign prisoners of war.
- From May 1945 until April 1946 the U.S. Army Personnel and Separation Center processed nearly 86,000 personnel for discharge from the Army.<sup>[8]</sup>





# Post World War Period

- From early 1946 to June 1947, the U.S. Army Disciplinary Barracks for convicted criminals was located at Camp Gordon, and the installation was scheduled for deactivation.
- In September 1948 the Army relocated the Military Police School from Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania, to Camp Gordon, and in October 1948 a Signal Corps training center was activated.
- During the 1950s and into the 1970s Fort Gordon served as a basic training facility under the US Third Army. In 1974 the Army moved its main Signal School from Ft. Monmouth NJ to Ft. Gordon to consolidate all signal training in one location. The activity was designated the US Army Signal Center and Fort Gordon.
- At the same time, the Army moved the MP School to Ft. McClellan AL and the Civil Affairs School to Ft. Bragg NC. Since June 1986 Fort Gordon has been the home of the Signal Corps Regiment, the branch of the U.S. Army responsible for providing and maintaining information systems and communication networks.
- In September 2014, the US Army established the US Army Cyber branch and Cyber School at Fort Gordon. Both the Signal School and Cyber School are subordinate elements of the US Army Cyber Center of Excellence, the headquarters which was formerly known as the US Army Signal Center of Excellence.



# History Vignettes

# AVIATION

- The **Aviation Section, Signal Corps**,<sup>[1]</sup> was the [aerial warfare](#) service of the United States from 1914 to 1918, and a direct statutory ancestor of the [United States Air Force](#).
- It absorbed and replaced the [Aeronautical Division, Signal Corps](#), and conducted the activities of Army aviation until its statutory responsibilities were suspended by President [Woodrow Wilson](#) in 1918. The Aviation Section organized the first squadrons of the aviation arm and conducted the first military operations by United States aviation on foreign soil.
- The Aviation Section, Signal Corps was created by the 63rd Congress (Public Law 143) on 18 July 1914 after earlier legislation to make the aviation service independent from the Signal Corps died in committee.
- From July 1914 until May 1918 the aviation section of the Signal Corps was familiarly known by the title of its administrative headquarters component at the time, seen variously as the Aeronautical Division, Air Division, Division of Military Aeronautics, and others. For historic convenience, however, the air arm is most commonly referred to by its official designation, the Aviation Section, Signal Corps (ASSC), and is the designation recognized by the United States Air Force as its predecessor for this period.<sup>[1]</sup>



# HOLLYWOOD



**Frank Russell Capra** (born **Francesco Rosario Capra**; May 18, 1897 – September 3, 1991) was an [Italian-American](#) film director, producer and [writer](#) who became creative force behind [some of the major award-winning films of the 1930s and 1940s](#). Born in Italy and raised in Los Angeles from the age of five, his [rags-to-riches](#) story has led film historians such as [Ian Freer](#) to consider him the "[American Dream](#) personified."<sup>[2]</sup>

Capra became one of America's most influential directors during the 1930s, winning three [Academy Awards](#) for [Best Director](#) from six nominations, along with three other Oscar wins from nine nominations in other categories.

Among his leading films were [It Happened One Night](#) (1934), [You Can't Take It with You](#) (1938), and [Mr. Smith Goes to Washington](#) (1939); Capra was nominated as Best Director and as producer for [Academy Award for Best Picture](#) on all three films, winning both awards on the first two.

During World War II, Capra served in the [U.S. Army Signal Corps](#) and produced [information films](#), such as the [Why We Fight](#) series.

## DARRYL F. ZANUCK: "THE LONGEST DAY"

June 6, 1944. D-Day at Normandy. It was the Allied invasion of northern France. Most Americans are familiar with the event and many have seen the movie *The Longest Day*. But how many Signal soldiers know the Signal connection with the producer of this epic war film, Darryl F. Zanuck?

Darryl Zanuck was born in Nebraska in 1902. He moved to California at age six and began working in films by eight. At fifteen he lied about his age to join the Nebraska National Guard and ended up serving on the Mexican Border and in France during WWI. He was only eighteen when the war ended. After the war Zanuck

did some writing and sold his first movie script in 1922 to a Hollywood producer. He soon began working with Warner Brothers as a script writer. During this time he wrote plots for the popular *Rin Tin Tin* movie series. As an executive producer Zanuck was instrumental in helping Warner Brothers make the change to sound with the 1927 film *The Jazz Singer*. He became a studio manager in 1928 and later became chief of production. Zanuck had essentially become the right hand man of Jack Warner in a few short years. Other great hits he produced at the time were *Little Caesar* (1930) and *The Public Enemy* (1931). After being denied a share in the ownership of the studio, Zanuck made his next move in the film industry.

In 1933 Zanuck became a co-founder of Twentieth Century Pictures. In 1935 the company bought Fox Studios and formed Twentieth Century Fox. He produced *The Grapes of Wrath* in 1940 followed by *How Green Was My Valley* in 1941.



In 1942 Zanuck was commissioned a Colonel in the Signal Corps. His first assignment was a military observer attached to the American Embassy in London. During this time he negotiated agreements with the British Minister of Information and the Soviet Film Bureau to coordinate information and training films for the Allies. On 19 August 1942 he accompanied Canadian, British, and American troops on the raid at Dieppe, France. Colonel Zanuck was then sent to the Aleutian Islands of Alaska to supervise the production of the first film of a War Department historical film series for public information. This feature film in technicolor, entitled *Report from the Aleutians*, won a New York Film Critics award.

Colonel Zanuck was next assigned to oversee the production of the second feature film in the historical series, *At the Front in North Africa*. He organized special photographic detachments to cover the amphibious landings. The film incorporated no staged material or special effects. All of its combat scenes were real. Zanuck received a Legion of Merit for his role. He continued on to supervise production of films during the fighting in Italy, returning to Twentieth Century Fox studio in 1944.

In 1962 he completed what many consider his greatest film accomplishment, *The Longest Day*. Filmed on location in Corsica and Normandy as well as on sets in Paris, the film used the services of forty-eight technical supervisors and a who's who of Hollywood legends such as John Wayne, Robert Mitchum, Henry Fonda, Eddie Albert, Richard Burton, Sean Connery, Robert Ryan, Sal Mineo, Paul Anka, Red Buttons, Roddy McDowell, Fabian, Edmund O'Brien, and Robert Wagner. At a cost of \$10 million, it was a major production and a box office success with \$40 million.

## THEODOR SEUSS "TED" GEISEL

Theodor Seuss "Ted" Geisel was born on March 2, 1904, in Massachusetts. He was a distinguished American children's author, political cartoonist, illustrator, poet, animator, screenwriter, and filmmaker. He spent most of his career writing immensely popular children's books under the pen name of Dr. Seuss. The most popular without a doubt is "The Cat in the Hat".



One of the most successful wartime animated characters, Private Snafu, was the brainchild of Frank Capra who headed the Army Motion Picture Unit. Geisel commanded the animation section, and did the majority of writing, for the 26 episodes that were produced between 1943 and 1945. Private Snafu was a Soldier used for teaching lessons to the troops. The material was presented in a manner that was both entertaining and educational.



Usually, Snafu was shown doing the wrong thing due to laziness or ignorance. The intention of the cartoons was for Soldiers to learn from Snafu's mistakes.




Ted Geisel left the Army after WWII as a Lieutenant Colonel and received the Legion of Merit for his contribution to the war effort. He passed away on September 24, 1991 in La Jolla, California, where he and his wife had moved after the war. Geisel's birthday, March 2, is celebrated as the annual date for National Read Across America Day, an effort to promote reading created by the National Education Association.



During WWII, the U.S. Army Signal Corps attracted many prominent Hollywood film artists. One of the most famous was Ted Geisel. He served with the Signal Corps Pictorial Service making training films. Ted worked with other notable artists such as the iconic film director Frank Capra who is best known for "Mr. Smith Goes to Washington" and "It's a Wonderful Life" both starring Jimmy Stewart. Ted also worked with directors Chuck Jones and Friz Freleng as well as the voice artist supreme Mel Blanc and the music director Carl Stalling. Geisel deplored racism at home against Jews and blacks that harmed the war effort and depicted this view in some of his early wartime cartoons.






