Dear Majority Leader McConnell, Minority Leader Schumer, Chairman Shelby, and Vice Chairman Leahy:

The Military Coalition (TMC), representing more than 5.5 million current and former service members, veterans and their families and survivors, strongly encourages you to pass the Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 Defense Appropriations Act and Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, and Related Agencies Appropriations bills before the current fiscal year ends on September 30, 2019. We remain a nation at war. The total force simply cannot remain effective, absent adequate and timely defense authorizations and appropriations passed by the Congress.

As you know, a return to continuing resolutions (CRs) would stymie the Military Services' ability to grow, equip, and train the total force – Regular, Guard, Reserve, and Civilians – necessary to meet today's dynamic and growing threats. The crippling strain would be worsened by preventing the Military Services from starting new programs that are needed to improve readiness, lethality and overmatch. Resources would tighten severely, procurement programs would languish, and taxpayer dollars would not be spent where most needed.

TMC applauds Congress' timely passage of FY 2019 DoD appropriations, for the first time in a decade. Last year's on-time Defense and Military Construction Appropriations provided important funding stability to build readiness and conduct the process to modernize our Armed Forces. A return to the use of CRs would jeopardize training, maintenance, modernization, and quality of life programs, in addition to critical programs impacting our nation's 20 million Veterans. In summary, our national security requires stable, predictable funding and prudent long-range planning.

Please pass these crucial appropriations bills by September 30, 2019, to maintain our national security and to support our Armed Forces, their families, and our nation's veterans.
