We had one of our Chapter Vice-Presidents get real involved with speaking to the next generation about Service and Veterans. CSM (ret) Rob Fortenberry was the

guest speaker for the Orlando STEM Charter 7th Grade Middle School Class on 10 November. He says:

"This year I decided to take a different approach to the traditional guest speaker roles I have taken since retiring from the U.S. Army. The message was a little less complicated and the audience was certainly much younger than the typical



Veteran population from the previous podium speeches I have presented. In the true spirit of the "Soldier for Life" narrative of telling your story, I was invited to guest speak about Veterans Day to a group of students from the most diverse school in Orange County, Orlando. The Orlando Science Charter Middle School for STEM educates some

of the brightest and most insightful young people I have ever had the pleasure of speaking with. The topic was simple "What does Veterans Day mean to me and the importance of the day for Americans." I leveraged the topic of Veterans Day

and an approachable mentality to engage in a dialog with the students so that they understand that Veterans are ordinary Americans with an extraordinary desire to be part of something bigger than themselves. We spend much of our time together answering questions and



breaking stereotypes and barriers to build an appreciation for our Veteran's service. The students and I both left the school cafeteria that day with a better appreciation for the significance of Veterans Day and that our actions every day as Americans to make our country a better place is the thanks that all Veterans really appreciate."

Annual National AUSA Meeting



Rubio; Mr. Barry Cotton, Senior Military Specialist, Office of U.S. Senator Rick Scott; Mr. Josh Bowes, Military and Veteran Liaison for Congressman Darren Soto (FL-9); and Ms. Sarah Elbadri, Deputy District Director for Congressman Maxwell Frost (FL-10). Other guests included veterans from the OVAHCS Assisted Living Facility, the OVAHCS Veterans

Homeless Facility, OVAHCS Staff, CFVMPF Board members, and veterans from the Lake Nona Veterans Association. COL Voorhees laid a wreath after the ceremony at the Memorial Arch. The Foundation recently added new plaques to the wall. There were approximately 300 in attendance in total. As always, everyone is welcome to attend. "This momentous occasion not only pays tribute to the heroic contributions of Veterans but also underscores the OVAHCS unwavering commitment to ensuring their well-being," said OVAHCS Director/CEO, Timothy J. Cooke. Look for event parking in the east and west parking garages, and in any available parking spots located in the south parking lot near the emergency room. The VA asks attendees to refrain from parking in the Community Living Center and Domiciliary parking lots. In addition, Golf cart shuttles will be operating to assist with transporting attendees to and from the ground floor of both the east and west parking garages.
